FIRST ROUND OF COMPETITION IS OVER!

The meeting of the General Assembly (all team leaders and deputy leaders participated), during which the tasks for the first day of the competition were chosen, went smoothly and with high level of concordance between colleagues.

The difficult part of the job was the very start – the translation of 3 chosen tasks into the mother tongue of each country. Croatian team finished minutes after midnight, the last were the Koreans, who left the Translation room (popularly known by the name of Spider) after 4 a.m.

The competition started with 4 minutes delay, in the 8A hall of Zagreb Fair, especially adapted for the IOI 2007. After five hours of deep concentration, the results were finalized. From the technical point of view everything worked perfectly.

Mr. Bojan Antolović, the president of the Scientific Committee told us that 290 contestants attended the competition, out of which 60 solved the first task, 24 of them solved the second task and 12 solved the third task.








VISIT TO VICE PRIME MINISTER, MRS. JADRANKA KOSOR

On August 17th, the IOI International Committee and the IOI Organizing Committee representatives were received by the Vice Prime Minister of the Republic of Croatia, Jadranka Kosor. Mr. Alen Spiegl, the president of the Organizing Committee, presented some details about the event organization and progress, while Mr. Zide Du, the president of the IOI, gave brief introduction about the IOI and Olympiads in general. Mr. Pieter Waker, an observer from South Africa, Mr. Jari Koivisto, IOI Executive Director, Mr. Krassimir Manev, IC member from Bulgaria, Zdravko Galić, representative of the Office of the president of Croatia and Tomislav Vujec, IOI General Assembly Chairman also joined the discussion about the IOI and Informatics in general. Minister Kosor expressed gratitude to the IC for honouring Croatia with an opportunity to host such an event.

Mohamed Tawfik from Egypt who participates for the third year in IOI competitions is happy that his country will be the host



of the next IOI 2008 in Egypt, but on the other hand he regrets that he won't travel to another country.

Marcin Andrychowitz and **Tomasz Kulczynski** from Poland are very satisfied with the problem tasks they got. They shared with us their impression on the test.

Tomasz: «I think problems were not too easy but I am satisfied. I worried a bit because I thought it would be too warm in the competition room to think at the high speed, but it was ok.»

Marcin said: «For me there were two easy problems and one quite difficult. However, I solved it. In Poland we have high level of our national team in informatics, so problems were, generally speaking, difficult.»

Arindam Saha from India said after the test:

«I tried my best, but I didn't solve everything. The time was limited. If I had had a couple of hours more I would have solved all of them for sure. I don't know my score yet, I have to find my leader.»



Lauri Rentta from Finland who won the bronze medal last year agreed with the majority of contestants that the problem tasks weren't easy, but like every competitor he tried to solve them. «The other members of our team also agree that it wasn't easy to find the correct algorithms.»

Rati Gelashvili from Georgia told us: «Problems were in fact difficult and original, I liked them and working on these tasks was rather interesting. They weren't easy to catch.»

Radwa Metwali from Egypt – «It's my first time on this competition, it seems that the problems were pretty demanding.»
